The interim governor of the province of Texas reports to Your Lordship that on the 14th of this month, without the slightest incident [to report], Chief Flechazo of the Vidais nation arrived at this capital with 15 Indian warriors, 2 women, and 4 Indians of the Orcoquiza nation. ~~to whom~~ They came ~~were~~ for their gifts and to assure their lasting peace, and they are lodged in the quarters which were built for that purpose.

My dear sir: On the 14th of the current [month], Chief Flechazo of the Vidais nation arrived at this capital with 15 Indian warriors and 2 women ~~in~~ and four Indians of the Orcoquiza nation who came along with them. Having made a stop at the presidio of La Bahía, [they came] for the purpose of expressing to me their friendship and lasting peace, and to receive the gifts ~~which for them~~ in the manner of the other nations. ~~of the North~~ They brought no news. I report this to Your Lordship for your intelligence, having ordered them // ^{lv} lodged in the quarters built for that purpose.
