

Appendix 1 -- Notebooks

R. L. Moore kept dozens of notebooks (mostly 6.5"X8.5", brown, and ruled) that document his work and personal life. Most notebooks were assigned numbers when they were brought into the archives. The numbers do not reflect Moore's original ordering of the notebooks, nor do they reflect a chronological order for the books. Instead, they are used as a serial system for ease of reference. The sorting and analysis of the notebooks was completed by M. H. Proffitt of the University of Texas at Austin in 1975. Generally, the listing for each notebook begins with the first few words from the first page or cover of the notebook. If loose sheets or pages were found in the notebook, they have been flattened and included in the folder. The notebooks have been placed in the category to which most of their contents pertain, although it should be noted that some notebooks include material on more than one subject. The following cross-reference guide is included to help researchers locate the notebooks they need:
