The interim governor of the province of Texas reports to Your Lordship that Chief Flechazo returned with Vidais and Orcoquiza Indians to the presidio of La Bahía on the twentieth of this month. They were given their gifts and left the presidio for their villages on the 26th, according to the report on that date by the captain, Don Luis Cazorla. [They were] accompanied by three soldiers sent to escort them.

My dear sir: On the 4th of the [month] about to end, in official letter no. 43, I reported to Your Lordship on the arrival at this capital of Chief Flechazo, of the Vidais nation, with 15 warriors, 2 women, and four Indians of the Orcoquiza nation who came along with them.

On the 19th of the same [month], they received their gifts and departed on the 20th back to the presidio of La Bahía, accompanied to said presidio by three soldiers which I provided them. They arrived there without

incident // ^{lv} and left for their villages on the 26th, according to the report on that date of Captain Don Luis Cazorla. [They went] with the three soldiers and had not left earlier because of the heavy rains.
